## STARS Parent/Professional Training Sessions 2024-25

These workshops aim to provide information for parents to support their autistic child at home. Professionals should access these sessions and then use the slides and resources to deliver the training to their setting's parents.

September 6 <sup>th</sup> 2024 9:45-11:15	A Celebratory introduction to Neurodiversity in the Early Years	A celebratory approach to supporting autistic children in the early years. Celebrating and accepting neurodivergent and autistic differences, using strengths to support learning and embedding positive language and attitudes within the early years.
October 4 <sup>th</sup> 2024 9:45-11:15	Emotional Well-being	This session will explore why autistic children and young people are at greater risk of poor mental health. We will discuss how we can work with children and young people to explore the causes of poor mental health, overcome barriers to wellbeing, and support the development of coping mechanisms.
November 8 <sup>th</sup> 2024 9:45-11:15	Sensory Support in the Home	This session will give a brief introduction to sensory processing and regulation, exploring its importance in supporting the wellbeing of autistic children and young people. The session will also offer advice around sensory support strategies that can be implemented in the home.
December 7 <sup>th</sup> 2024 9:45-11:15	Identity and Diagnosis	The focus of this session is to discuss ways parents and carers can support their child/young person to understand and embrace their autism as part of who they are. This session will include: 1) The advantages of the child or young person knowing that they are autistic. 2) Approaches and resources that parents can care givers can utilise to assist their child/young person in understanding what autism means to them.
January 10 <sup>th</sup> 2025 9:45-11:15	Visual Supports in the Home EY	An introduction to using visual strategies in the home when supporting children to understand home routines and verbal instructions, providing strategies for independence. This session has an Early Years focus but many of the strategies discussed can be developed to support older children.
January 10 <sup>th</sup> 2025 9:45-11:15	Keeping autistic children and young people safe online	During this workshop we will explore the importance of different types of online media to autistic identity and wellbeing. We will discuss how much online media is too much

		and how to establish appropriate limits. We will explore risks and protective measures i
